- 1. Review and Approve Agenda: Councilmember Tom Saxhaug made a motion to remove the Open Meeting Law review/conflict of interest information/discussion item from the agenda due to a presenter conflict and approve the agenda as amended Motion Prevailed
- **2. Review and Approve Minutes:** Councilmember Kristin Eggerling made a motion to approve the minutes from May 22, 2024 **Motion Prevailed**
- **3. Conflicts of Interest Reported:** No new conflicts of interest were reported by Councilmembers. Previous reports of conflicts still stand.
- **4. Chair's Comments:** Chair Hartwell thanked staff for organizing the June 11, 2024 tour and drew members' attention to the discussion of the Keystone Woods federal encumbrance request that would be presented later in the meeting.
- **5. Executive Director's Report:** Executive Director Mark Johnson reported three minor conversation/conveyance requests to the Council. The requests came from Trust for Public Land, MN DNR, and The Nature Conservancy. Council discussion followed. It was decided by the Council that more information was needed regarding the conversion/conveyance request from The Nature Conservancy, prior to staff seeking legislative approval. Staff was directed to bring the additional information to the Council for discussion at the July 2024 meeting. Mr. Johnson also announced that Commission Assistant Amanda Schnabel had accepted a job with the Legislative Budget Office and would be transitioning out of her current role with the Council. Mr. Johnson thanked Ms. Schnabel for her four years of Council service. Mr. Johnson also thanked all OHF partners who participated in the previous day's tour.

- **6. DNR-Partner Acquisition Continuous Improvement Project:** Kerstin Larson, Strategic Land Asset Management Supervisor, Division of Lands and Minerals with MN DNR and Katherine Sherman-Hoehn, Grants Manager with MN DNR provided the Council with an update on the work that the Joint DNR-Partner Land Acquisition Continuous Improvement Project has done to date. Council discussion followed. DNR Staff was directed to return to the Council within 6 months to deliver an update on progress made.
- 7. Request for North Country Trail Easement Carlton County Lands: Mark Westphal, Land Commissioner with Carlton County Land Department and Matt Davis with the North Country Trail Association presented a request for a North Country Trail easement related to the ML 2019, First Special Session, Ch. 2, Art. 1, Sec. 2, Subd. 5(p) Conservation Partners Legacy Grant Program, Phase 11 appropriation. Council discussion followed.

Request for Approval of Conversion/Conveyance – DNR Request for Federal Encumbrance to be placed on 450 acre parcel within Keystone Woods WMA acquisition.: Ann Pierce, Parks and Trails Director with MN DNR, Sarah Wennerberg, Senior Grants Specialist with MN DNR, and Dave Olfelt Fish and Wildlife Division Director with MN DNR presented a request for approval to place a federal encumbrance on a 450 acre parcel within the Keystone Woods WMA acquisition, related to the ML 2023, Ch. 40, Art. 1, Sec. 2, subd. 5(h) – Metro Big Rivers, Phase 13 program and the ML 2023, Ch. 40, Art. 1, Sec. 2, subd. 5(k) – St. Croix Watershed Habitat Protection and Restoration, Phase 4 program appropriations.
