Director Smitten described a recent private landowner access easement conveyance which was administratively approved. Director Smitten shared an updated document on the status and spending of ML 2022 programs with acquisition dollars budgeted. Director Smitten reported that Council members should expect an invitation to an upcoming 75th anniversary celebration for the Wildlife Management Area program. 7. Presentation/Discussion: DNR Roving Crew Proposal Classification [\(0:25:07\)](#)

Chair Hartwell provided an overview of the Council's past practices and historical precedent relating to the classification and funding of the DNR Roving Crew program. In the attached memo, Chair Hartwell and Vice Chair Schara proposed to members the adoption of a procedure to categorize present and future DNR Roving Crew proposals with a proposal ID of "Other" alongside DNR administrative programs. The proposed procedure would allow the Council to allocate funding to Roving Crew proposals at the base level of funding requested to maintain a cohort of 5 crews of up to 8 staff, as opposed to calculating an average allocation based on individual member evaluations. Chair Hartwell noted that this would not require the Council to provide funding or to provide funding at the amount requested.

9. Presentation/Discussion: CPL Program Modifications for ML 2026 Program

David Stein, CPL Program Coordinator, MN Department of Natural Resources (DNR), provided an overview presentation on modifications made to the ML 2026 CPL program in response to legislative changes in the CPL appropriation law in M.L. 2026, Regular Session, Chapter 126, Article 1, Section 2, subd. 5(aa). Legislation required the CPL program fund competitive matching grants to organizations within the seven-county metropolitan area and cities with a population of 50,000 or more.

Mr. Stein noted the CPL program will complete two rounds of grant applications, and described allowable activities and expenses, as well as eligible applicants. Mr. Stein described enhanced partner coordination and outreach efforts undertaken by DNR CPL staff to identify eligible partner organizations and encourage the submission of project proposals.

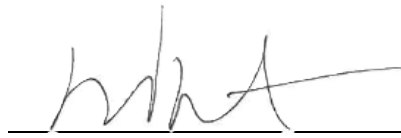
13. Public Testimony
